

Vista half cent sales tax

Information you should know

In November, 2006 Vista voters approved a half-cent sales tax to fund the building of much needed community improvement projects in the city.

The City asked residents what they wanted in their community. Public safety was the number one priority. In addition, the community asked for several other projects to enhance the quality of life in Vista.

These projects are now either completed or will be by fall 2010.

- Two new fire stations and renovations on Fire Station No. 1
- Renovated Moonlight
- New Sports Park
- New Civic Center



Two new fire stations, Station No. 5 in south Vista and Station No. 6 in central Vista opened in 2009 and renovations on Fire Station No. 1 are nearing completion. Response times have been reduced greatly, which helps out with the increasing calls for service in the city.



Moonlight Amphitheatre renovations: a new modern stage, lighting, sound, and parking for people with disabilities.



Vista Sports Park: new 16-acre park in northwest Vista: soccer/foot-ball, baseball/softball fields, picnic areas.



A new Civic Center will house most of the city departments in one place to provide better service to the community. A large community center will be available for the public to use.
