Weekday breakfast and showers are at Interfaith community Services. Referrals are through The Salvation Army Family Services office at 760-745-8685.

La Posada is located in **Carlsbad** near Palomar Airport. It operates a year-round shelter for farm-workers and men in need of shelter. During the Winter, starting December 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009, it offers an additional 25 beds for men in need of shelter. You must be referred to them by another agency such as law enforcement, Salvation Army, Lifeline, Community Resource Center or a church. Their facilities include showers. Breakfast and supper are served.

Dear Friend,

If you are in need of shelter this Winter, we hope that one of our Regional shelters will provide you with a safe place to sleep at night along with help to get your life back on track. These are night-time shelters. During the day, we would like you to be out in the community working on your own self-development. We will provide support and help but only you can choose to change your life. We encourage you to make that hard choice.

Our North County shelters are all part of a Regional system. You may not move from one shelter to another unless you have a specific reason such as finding a job in the other location.

When you apply to be in our four larger shelters, you will be tested for drugs. We will also ask you to take a breathalyzer test each evening when you come to the shelter, to maintain an alcohol-free environment. There will also be drug testing randomly and whenever someone's conduct or appearance calls for it.

Please do not panhandle or loiter in public places. This means no standing with a sign asking for money, stopping strangers and asking for money, or loitering in public places. Although a few people might stop and give some money, many others will complain to authorities and this puts our shelters at risk. Public complaints about panhandling and loitering can result in loss of community support for our shelters.

You will meet each week with your case manager in the evening at the shelter to discuss your needs, available community resources, and your progress. Your case manager will then issue you a voucher for your next week in the shelter.

We believe that with the help of our case management program and supportive services from many community partners, you can move out of homelessness to a better situation. We wish you well.
